- India’s longest Road is Grand Trunk Road (G.T. Road). It is the First National Highway.
- The longest National Highway is NH44 which connects Varanasi & Kanyakumari.
- Different categories of Roads are motorways, Highways, National Highway, Express Ways, International Highways, Border Roads.
- The state having largest road network in India is Maharashtra.
- The official name of Marine Drive in Mumbai is Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Road.
- The Golden Quadrilateral is the largest ongoing highway project in India which will connect the metropolitan cities Mumbai, Kolkata, Delhi and Chennai.
- Sikkim is the state with least number of National Highways .

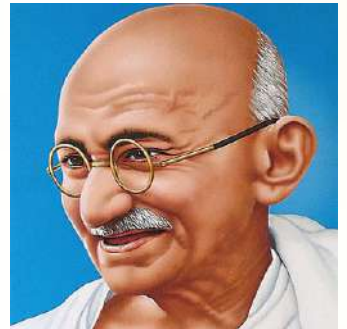
