
A warm welcome to all our young space adventurers!

★ An easy way (mnemonics) to remember the order of the planets from the Sun:

★ The *Sun* is so big, it could fit over 1 million Earths (10 lakhs) inside it.

★ The distance from Earth to the Sun is 93 million miles or 149 million kilometers (**1,49,60,00,000 kms**).

★ **Mars** is known as the '*Red Planet*' because of its rusty, iron-rich soil.

★ **Venus** is the hottest planet in our solar system. & it is known as the '*morning star*' or '*evening star*'.



★ **Saturn's** rings are made mostly of ice and dust particles.
